- **Traditional Oral Presentation:** More of a traditionalist? Submit an abstract to give a 20-minute presentation. Similar topics will be combined to form 60- or 90-minute sessions.
- **Short and Sweet Presentation:** Ready to change it up? Submit an abstract to tell your story in 10 minutes or less with minimal use of text. This is your opportunity to be creative and experiment with presentation techniques. Similar topics will be combined to form 60- or 90-minute sessions.

- **Tools Showcase:** Have a cool online tool to highlight? Submit an abstract to demonstrate a tool interactively to participants.
- **Storytelling or Group Discussion:** Just want to talk, discover new partnership opportunities, or share stories? Propose a resilience or adaptation topic—or “stories no one tells”—to lead an interactive discussion around challenges or successes. You will organize a session of 60 or 90 minutes. There will be a limited number of these slots available.
